Greetings Honorable Tribal Leaders and Tribal Partners:

SUBJECT: Collaboration-Invitation to Tribal Briefing on Two Environmental Justice Grants

In accordance with <u>chapter 43.376 RCW</u>, the <u>Washington State Centennial Accord of 1989</u>, and <u>Department of Health (DOH) Consultation and Collaboration Procedure</u>, we invite collaboration with Tribes and Tribal organizations in the development of policies, agreements, and program implementation that directly affects Tribes and Tribal people. I am writing today to invite your collaboration on two grant programs, the <u>Workplace Safety for Workers Affected by Climate Change Grant and the Community</u> <u>Budgeting for Decarbonization and Resilience Grant</u>. The development of these grant programs is a significant agency action under RCW <u>70A.02.010</u>.

This is a follow-up letter to the Dear Tribal Leader Letter sent on June 14, 2023, for <u>DOH Implementation</u> of New Grant Programs During 2023- 2024 Biennium and on August 28th, 2023, for <u>Invitation to</u> <u>Consultation</u>. The focus of the Workplace Safety for Workers Affected by Climate grant is workplace health and safety for farmworkers, construction workers, and other workers who face the most risk from climate-related effects. The focus of the Community Budgeting for Decarbonization and Resilience grant is to select five geographically diverse overburdened communities in Washington to engage in participatory budgeting projects that center on decarbonization and resilience.
